APOSW is a voluntary organization whose primary role is to advance pediatric psychosocial oncology care and promote the interests of social work within pediatric oncology – it is the VOICE of the social work profession within the larger world of childhood cancer. Our purpose is to educate professionals, the general public, and cancer patients, their families and friends.

Membership in APOSW gives social work members, including associate and student members, an opportunity to be in control of their professional development. APOSW membership can lead to an increased awareness of psychosocial issues and support for collective actions among members. This knowledge and exposure can help members enhance their clinical skills, increasing their efficacy in advocating skillfully for the families with whom they work.

APOSW membership can lead to educational, personal, and professional development provided through our networking, conferences, committee work, special interest working groups, and scholarship opportunities. APOSW also affords its members opportunities for visibility, support, and access to leaders and partners who share an interest in advancing pediatric psychosocial oncology care through clinical social work practice, research, advocacy, education, and program development.
